

IPF ATID 2025 IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS

The IPF Atid community is more deeply engaged than ever, fostering a growing network of young leaders committed to building Israel's future as a secure, Jewish, and democratic.

4,000+

unique young professionals participated in IPF Atid programs in 2025, marking a **14% increase** from the previous year. Participation in our **seven chapter cities** reached **3,600 unique individuals**.



~400

events were hosted by IPF Atid, providing **clear, credible, and accessible analysis** on the Israeli-Palestinian conflict.

5

events were attended on average by repeat attendees. Approximately **800 individuals** form our highly engaged core of repeat participants.



9,000

total attendees participated in IPF Atid policy and community events across **23 cities**.

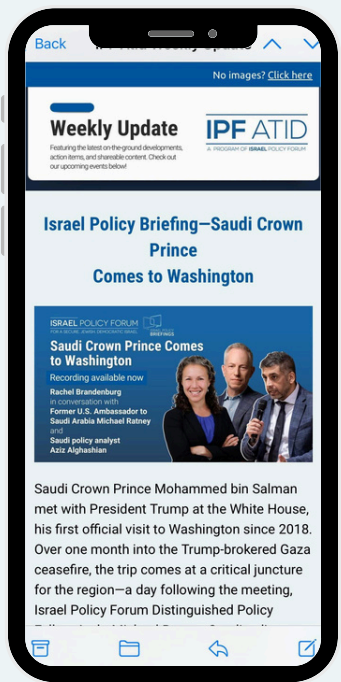

Shared Values Project

A year-long fellowship with summits in Tel Aviv and Washington, D.C., for exceptional Israeli and American leaders dedicated to shared Jewish and democratic values.

Charles Bronfman Conveners Program

In Washington, D.C., young professionals from across North America engage in nuanced conversations on the Israeli-Palestinian conflict and a two-state outcome.

Delegation to Israel and the West Bank

Seven-day program in Israel for lay leaders to deepen their understanding of regional politics and security.

Leadership Summit

Three-day program for chapter lay leaders across North America to strategize with Israel Policy Forum board members and enhance programming for a secure, Jewish, and democratic Israel.
