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2025 IMPACT BY THE NUMBERS

The IPF Atid community is more deeply engaged than ever, fostering a growing network of young leaders committed to building Israel's future as a secure, Jewish, and democratic.

4,000+

unique young professionals participated in IPF Atid programs in 2025, marking a **14% increase** from the previous year. Participation in our **seven chapter cities** reached **3,600 unique participants**.

~400

events were hosted by IPF Atid, providing **clear, credible, and accessible analysis** on the Israeli-Palestinian conflict.



130+

unique partnerships were facilitated by IPF Atid, providing expertise for and building community with **Jewish organizations, policy think tanks, and college campuses**.

Seven-day program in Israel for chapter lay leaders to deepen their understanding of regional politics and security.

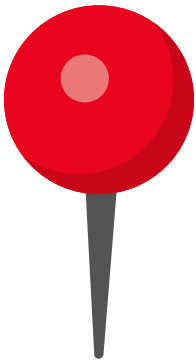
Leadership Summit

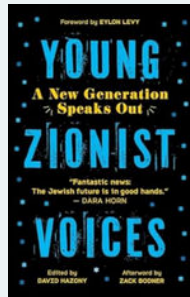
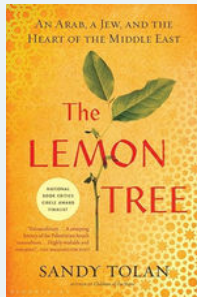
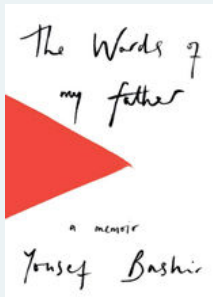

National partnerships build **networks.**

This year, IPF Atid engaged participants through event series and national partnerships that explore the full spectrum of issues relevant to young Jews today.

IPF Atid x Shalom Hartman Institute Siach Series

Partnership events that create space for thoughtful, values-based conversations on Israel and Jewish peoplehood.

IPF Atid x MemGlobal Moishe House

A partnership with MemGlobal's Moishe Houses to support educational Israel-focused programs, creating innovative events that blend cultural exploration, dialogue on current events, and leadership development for young Jewish adults.



IPF Atid x OneTable Shabbats

Collaborative Shabbat dinners that bring young Jewish professionals together for meaningful connection and community.



WPS Initiatives

Conversations aimed at amplifying women's involvement in foreign policy, national security, and peace efforts within our Women, Peace, and Security (WPS) initiative.

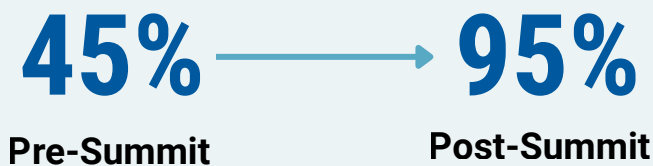
29% increase in partnership events compared to the previous year.

The Shared Values Project builds a liberal democratic ecosystem.

The Shared Values Project (SVP) connects exceptional American and Israeli participants working in policy, politics, and social impact through a cohort-based model that turns shared values into shared understanding and action.

Survey Results

SVP shifted how participants understand the connection between efforts in the U.S. and Israel to strengthen a secure, Jewish, and democratic Israel. The data below illustrates the dramatic increase in this understanding from pre- to post-summit.*

The Charles Bronfman Conveners Fellowship builds **expertise.**

The Charles Bronfman Conveners Fellowship equips exceptional next-generation leaders with the knowledge, relationships, and confidence to champion a secure, Jewish, and democratic Israel and a two-state outcome.

Survey Results

100% of participants felt more **confident** in their ability to advocate for Israel's future as secure, Jewish, and democratic after the summit.*

100% of participants also found IPF Atid's Charles Bronfman Conveners Fellowship **personally valuable**.*

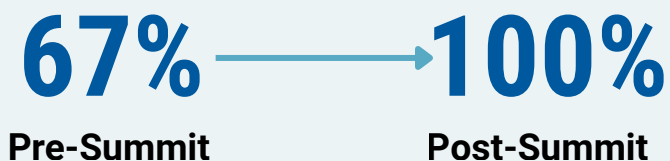

The Leadership Summit builds ambassadors.

The Leadership Summit empowers our lay leaders with the confidence and tools to engage thoughtfully and publicly on pragmatic pathways to resolve the Israeli-Palestinian conflict.

Survey Results

The summit **increased participants' confidence** to respond to public or peer questions about Israel Policy Forum at events. The data below show the large increase from pre- to post-summit.*

The Delegation to Israel and the West Bank builds confidence.

Through on-the-ground learning, the IPF Atid Delegation equips participants to navigate the Israeli-Palestinian conflict with both clarity and conviction based on first-hand knowledge.

Survey Results

After the delegation, **100% of the delegates felt more hopeful about Israel's future.***

Every delegate rated their likelihood of recommending IPF Atid's Delegation to others as **10/10** on a scale of 0-10.*

The delegation **increased delegates' confidence** in discussing Israel Policy Forum's core positions on key aspects of the Israeli-Palestinian conflict. The data below depict the dramatic increase from pre- to post-delegation.**

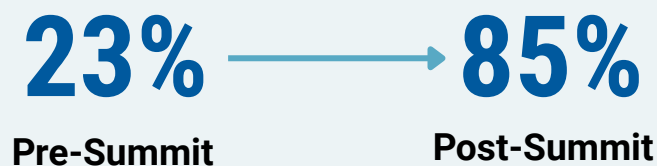

The Delegation to Israel and the West Bank builds **nuanced understanding.**

Survey Results

After the delegation, **100% of delegates felt inspired** that there are committed individuals on the ground working toward a better future for Israelis and Palestinians.*

The delegation **significantly improved delegates' preparedness** to discuss Palestinian politics, specifically the political realities of East Jerusalem and the West Bank. The data below illustrates the dramatic increase from pre- to post-delegation.**

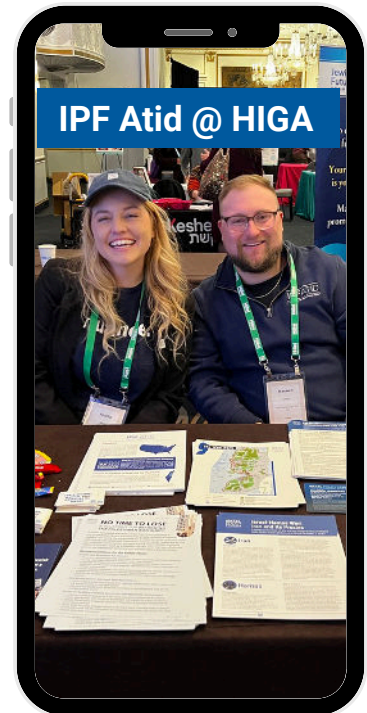
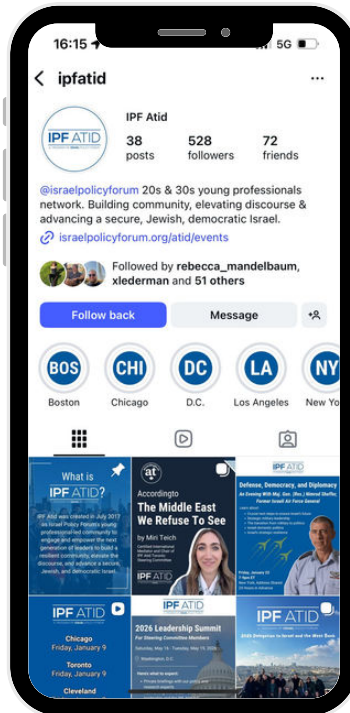

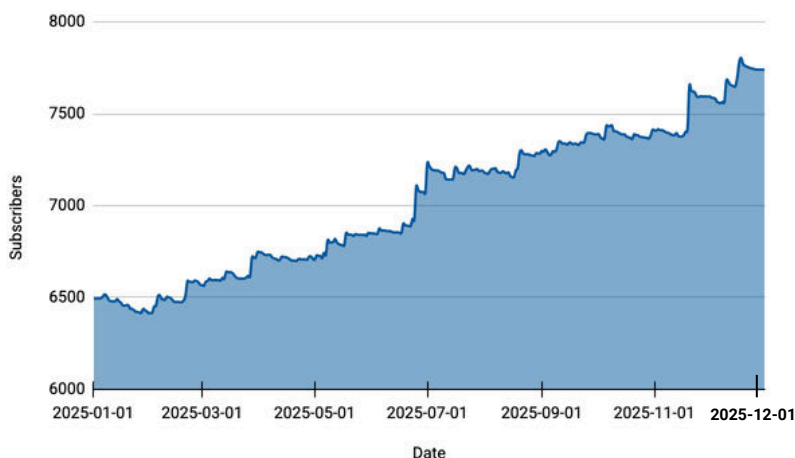

What's Next: IPF Atid in 2026

IPF Atid will significantly increase the impact of its programs by expanding series-based programming, building capacity among 300+ alumni leaders, and leveraging new staff in Cleveland and on the West Coast.

Deepen Chapter Infrastructure

By deploying new West Coast and part-time Cleveland staff, IPF Atid will strengthen the local leadership pipeline and community, while continuing to advance national partnerships. The launch of a Cleveland chapter in 2026 highlights IPF Atid's commitment to cultivating Jewish leadership and community impact in the region.

Build Alumni Network Capacity

By hosting an inaugural Charles Bronfman Convener Alumni Summit, IPF Atid will give alumni new opportunities to develop skills, build connections across cohorts, and strengthen their professional networks within policy and Jewish communal spaces.

Expand Series- Based Programs

IPF Atid will enhance participant experiences by continuing popular series, including Book Clubs, WPS, Siach, and OneTable, while creating 101-level materials on Israel and democracy. The series will build accessible programs that meet participants where they are and invite deeper engagement.
